Favorite Scripture: Saint of the Week!


One of the biggest highlights of worship this summer has been the sharing by Resurrection members during the service. In the Narthex you will find a coffee can and a personal invitation to:

Sunday School News

The Resurrection Sunday School year has concluded until fall. For every student in Sunday school, every Sunday was filled with a common focus drawn from the lectionary readings for the day. Because all age levels explore at least one common Bible reading each week, family members could discuss their discoveries together at home. In addition, in the church family, members explored the scriptures used in the Sunday worship and week by week, participated in the rhythms that guide the Church year – Advent, Christmas and Epiphany, Lent, Easter and Pentecost.

Immersion in a lectionary-based curriculum, such as Living the Good News, joins us with Christian believers throughout history and around the world. On any given Sunday, as we gather for morning worship and our age-graded sessions, we know that around the globe our larger Christian family gathers to hear the same stories and to proclaim the same truths. Our lectionary-based liturgical and educational experience joins us with saints of all places and ages – the unified, celebrating Body of Christ.

The repetitive nature of the three-year lectionary cycle means that one need not learn all there is to know about any given reading in a particular session. The growing child, the questioning adolescent, and the maturing adult each encounter these scriptures again and again at progressive stages of understanding.

This spring, Lutheran volunteers in the Wichita area joined Habitat for Humanity and Thrivent Financial to build affordable homes and change lives by helping two more families achieve home ownership. Last year, with generous volunteer help, these agencies celebrated completion of the 100th Habitat home in Wichita.

When you help build a Habitat home, know that you are helping to provide a decent, affordable home built with high quality materials and construction techniques, requiring low maintenance. Families selected as partners in this program have a need for adequate housing and meet very low income guidelines. They must have the ability to pay the Habitat 20 year, interest-free, profit-free mortgage, and contribute 250 to 400 hours of volunteer time. Their volunteer time (sweat equity) is spent physically helping on a build and in homeowner education classes such as budgeting, money management, home-maintenance, and being a good neighbor.

June Synod Assembly Notes

Pastor Leaf and Loretta represented our church at this year's synod assembly in Lindsborg, in June.

Opening the assembly, Bishop Mansholt stated, "We are still on that journey of putting our mission at the heart of our lives as God's people. The goal is for all congregations to be involved in mission." Three points he made are: God's mission continues in good times and bad. We remain the wealthiest church in the history of the world. God's grace is abundant.

Resolutions:

CSS Compensation Guidelines for 2010 – approved as presented.

Four resolutions related to memorial concerning recommendation on ministry policies:

1. Resolved, that the ELCA commit itself to finding ways to allow congregations that choose to do so to recognize, support, and hold publicly accountable life-long monogamous, same-gender relationships. Passed 240 - 145.

2. Resolved, that the ELCA commit itself to finding a way for people in such publicly accountable, lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships to serve as rostered leader or this church. Passed 216 – 178.

3. Resolved, that, in the implementation of these resolutions, the ELCA commit itself to bear on another's burdens, love the neighbor, and respect the bound consciences of all. Passed 274-118.

4. Resolved, (resolution too lengthy to include full test. See website.) Passed 230 – 169.
