

Dear members and friends of Resurrection,

Believe it or not Lent is just around the corner! That means Mid-Week services, soup suppers and the like. Ash Wednesday is February 17<sup>th</sup> this year. We will mark that day with the traditional service of *Penitence* with the "Imposition of Ashes." It is a somber time to remember what we have done and left undone which is contrary to God's desires. It is also a time to confront our mortality and exercise a regiment of discipline and devotion. This year our mid-week gatherings will focus on the parts of Luther's Small and Large Catechisms.

Early in its history the Lenten season became a time of education in the basics of the Christian faith for new converts seeking baptism at the Easter Vigil. Martin Luther encouraged preaching on the catechisms, especially during Lent. Using the catechisms as a basis for our midweek Lenten worship provides an opportunity to revisit some of the basic teachings of the Christian community. In addition to Luther's Small and Large Catechisms, we will have the opportunity to look at some of Luther's hymns (often written as teaching verses for the catechisms), prayers, and sermons for insights into the series.

This is my personal invitation to the entire congregation to come, worship, and take advantage of these worship and learning opportunities. They are prepared for your edification. Ash Wednesday, our Soup Supper begins at 6:00 p.m. and our worship is at 7:00 p.m.


### Lectionary Bible Study By Loretta Holmes

### HAYSVILLE HEALTH CARE CENTER OUTREACH

As many of you know, I have the privilege of conducting the worship service at the Haysville Health Care Center. It is an outreach for our church

which came about by my substituting for Pastor Leaf one time. When Pastor Leaf decided not to continue the service, the Center called me to ask if I would do it. From there it evolved to me doing one service a month on each second Sunday at 2:00 pm.

The other three men who conduct services there are ordained ministers and I am the only layman. When I first began doing services there on a regular basis, I asked a resident when they had last received communion. The reply was that it had been about three months prior. Believing that there is much healing in the Holy Communion, I said that I would correct that. Hence, we take a short break between service and communion so that anyone who does not wish to stay can leave. So, communion is celebrated monthly.

It was in the beginning of our ministry there that I became known as 'Pastor' or 'Reverend' even though I announced at the beginning of the service each month who I was and that our pastor was Pastor Tim Leaf. I am not an ordained minister and I tried hard to dissuade people from addressing me as such. Actually, I became a little frustrated in that endeavor, much to the amusement of Pastor Tim. Finally, one day when I was gripping about it to him and he was laughing, I said, "Okay! If you hear there is another Lutheran pastor in this area, move over!" Well, through the help of some of the staff, we finally settled on a title. I am Brother Bert and I can live with that.

Since we are the only liturgical church doing service, I have my altar in a suitcase, using one of the tables in the dining room where service is held. The white linen is placed, the Bible is there, a cross is in the center, the communion vessels are placed and covered, and at the beginning of the service the candles are lit. I preach from the lectionary almost without fail, although I have departed from it a few times.

As the communion elements have already been consecrated, I use the format of home communion. Whoever is accompanying our hymns assists me when the elements are offered,

which we do by intinction. Most residents are in wheelchairs or use walkers, so we move from one person to another.

Somewhere along the line, I realized that we should provide a social outlet and I proposed a coffee fellowship to follow and invited people to bring something to share such as a favorite poem. I have become acquainted with Suzanne Munyon, a resident at the Center, who has a Lutheran background. We have become good friends. Suzanne graciously acts as hostess and pours the coffee and we sit around and just chat or exchange ideas. This fellowship has led to the development of friendships and I often just drop by and circulate and chat and not infrequently have supper at Suzanne's table. The meals are good and nutritious.

I am assisted by willing musicians. Amy, our former Resurrection pianist, Evelyn Clark, and a Methodist gal, Linda Graber have taken turns playing for us and assisting me with communion. When Amy left, Roberta Gould filled her place, so I have three willing partners who enhance our service. I don't know what I would do without them.

It is such a joy to represent the church in this fashion. We are the only church outside of the Catholic Church (attending to just its own members) that brings communion. I am firmly convinced that communion is what draws people to our service. We have an average attendance of about 30 people and most stay for communion. To illustrate that the importance of the communion and to make an admission that I haven't gotten totally over being "Pastor", I will end by telling you that someone will occasionally ask my friend, Suzanne, 'Is your pastor is coming and is he bringing communion?'! Oh, well, you can't win them all.


