



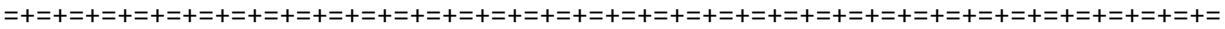

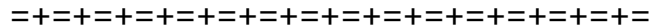
Please join me in praying for Tyson, MyKenzie, and Hannah as they prepare to affirm their baptisms in October.

Central States Synod Assembly

This annual meeting of our synod is being held at Bethany College in nearby Lindsborg this year. Pre-assembly workshops will be offered for 'early birds' on Thursday afternoon June 7th, at 2:00 & 3:00 pm. The assembly officially opens with worship at 7:00 pm Thursday. The Assembly will conclude at or before noon on Saturday, June 9th.

Determined by church membership, Resurrection can have three voting delegates. This year, Pastor Elizabeth, and Gerald and Alice Yoachim will be our representatives and voting delegates. Other church members are welcome to attend the assembly, although they are not able to cast a vote. Elections at the Synod Assembly will be: 1. a voting member for Churchwide Assembly, Pr. Tim Carey and Pr. Dave Fulton are nominated, 2. for Synod Council, Pr. Tom Hallstom is nominated.

Since the Synod Assembly is taking place in commute friendly Lindsborg this year, I do encourage church members to attend any or all parts of this meeting. It's an opportunity to meet and greet friends from many sister congregations, share plans, ideas, outcomes as well as become informed on the workings of our synod wide church.

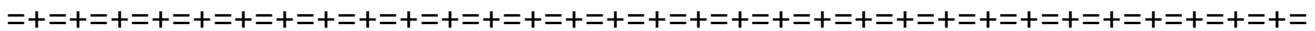

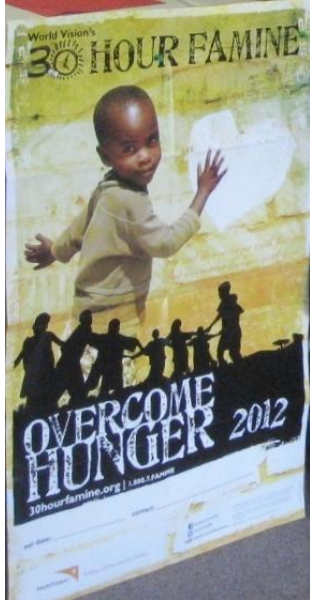

OVERCOME HUNGER 2012



In April, Resurrection's youth of middle and high school age were part of the 55 teens from six Haysville churches that took part in the 30 Hour Famine. This event was sponsored by the Haysville Youth Ministerial Association, joining with and raising money for World Hunger. Participants had a taste of hunger, and grew closer to God, by fasting (juice only) for 30 hours.

As they went without so others can eat, the teens also walked in the footsteps of hungry children half a world away.

The teens participated in five challenges to experience struggles people endure to meet basic needs: simulated physical disabilities brought on by continual malnutrition, hunger by fasting, displacement by having their meeting place relocated several times, farming by digging for vegetables, and food preparation by cooking breakfast. After the 30 Hour Famine, the fast concluded with Holy Communion and the 'break-fast' meal prepared and served by the youth and some church ladies.

Six Haysville churches helped the Haysville Youth Ministers organize the event: Resurrection Lutheran, Christian Chapel Foursquare, First Christian, Haysville Christian, Haysville Church of the Nazarene, and West Haysville Baptist. In lieu of Easter lilies this year, Resurrection folks gave \$611 to this worthy cause. Over \$5500 was raised to help overcome hunger. The best part of the weekend is not having eyes opened to a world of poverty and hunger, but realizing HOPE... and the promise that we can make a difference and be part of the solution.

Conversation with Claudia & Rod Howell



You have heard the saying that opposites attract! Meet Claudia and Rod Howell! Most folks at Resurrection soon know Claudia as the smiling choir member, Sunday School helper, Altar Guild server, summer song leader, always helpful with a ready hug lady. Most folks will be members for a while before they know Rod as the caring, dedicated, just on time every Sunday, end of a back row, out the door before coffee, dependable, man of few words kind of guy.

Claudia relates: I was born in Tucson, Arizona while my dad was in the Air Force. We rode cardboard pieces down hills, played kick the can, tether ball, and ice skated on a manmade rink when we lived in Pickstown, South Dakota, anything that was outside! We always lived where there were a lot of neighbor kids our age! My favorite toy when I was little was 'Zippy' the stuffed monkey, and a Tiny Tears doll. We had a dog named Boots whom we got

when I was in 5th grade and he lived until I was a sophomore in college. I think he was the only one thrilled to see me come home on break!!! My favorite teacher was Mr. Fredrickson who was my 6th grade teacher in Salina. He had polio when he was younger and walked with crutches but would take his students to the college when they had interesting travel shows on something we would study! He sent me a note when I graduated from nurses training and got engaged telling me how proud he was!!! He was a neat man! I have 2 sisters, Jan, who lives in Lawrence with her husband Virgil, and is a Democrat (I can't believe it, needless to say we don't talk politics), and Heidi, whose husband was killed in a car accident, and lives in Lenexa with her 2 boys. When Heidi was born, mom and dad said we could help name her. Our favorite movie at the time was Pollyanna, but they thought Pollyanna Walstrom was a little much so we went to our next favorite movie, Heidi, and so it was!!! We had to do dishes every night after supper and would have to take turns washing, drying, and clearing the dishes; everybody hated to dry because you would be there forever!!!!

I attended Salina Central High School in Salina and we were the last class to graduate before they split when they built Salina South High. Favorite classes were Latin, German, and of course playing clarinet in band. I went to college at Fort Hays State University for 2 years and then went to Wesley School of Nursing in Wichita for 2 years!

Rod stated, I was born in Belleville, KS, and have two sisters, Judy Willis and Linda Johnson. I attended Campus High School and my favorite activities were baseball, basketball and football. My favorite childhood memories are of fishing. I like ALL kinds of fishing but mostly bass. I never eat my catch, 'it's catch and release only'. A couple funny fish stories: While a teenager my best friend Steve and I might start out fishing on the Walnut River at Winfield and end up in Arkansas. Sometimes anyone that was with us ended up in Arkansas also. So the moral to that story was not to go fishing with Rod and Steve - unless you like Arkansas! As a dad, while fishing with family at Boeing Lake on one of the docks, my youngest boy, Casey, made a cast, stepped too far and fell into water over his head. Roger, my brother-in-law jumped in and lifted him out. Our older son, Kevin, asked Casey if he saw any fish while in the water. Casey stopped crying for a second to say, 'I think so!' and then began crying again.

When asked about fishing, Claudia says, "Fishing- I HATE to fish!!! Rod tells me to be quiet (can you imagine that) and I think it is too boring!!"

Rod attended a Presbyterian church in his youth, was baptized at Reformation Lutheran, Wichita, and married at Christ the King, Salina. He & Claudia joined Resurrection because they "reside in Haysville." Claudia said, I was baptized in Arizona in a Lutheran church as an infant. I was brought up Missouri Synod Lutheran, attended Christ the King Lutheran Church in Salina since 6th grade where I was confirmed and later married on July 20th, 1974. We came to Resurrection in 1980 on Pastor Swenson's first time preaching. He forgot his sermon notes in the car and I said this was the place for us!

Rick Clements greeted us at the door and made a great impression, and Evelyn Clark had been one of Rod's teachers. The people here are now family and we miss many who have moved on or have died.

Claudia remembers, "My mom was my greatest inspiration. She was a wonderful, kind woman who lived her faith every day. She was a nurse who had a wonderful relationship with her patients. She was a hospice nurse in Salina before she retired. She survived breast cancer and had Parkinson's disease, but as bad as it was for mom, I never heard her complain. She died in January of 2009. Boy do I miss her!!! With my mom's inspiration, I started out volunteering as a candy striper at St. Johns hospital in Salina, worked as a nurse's aide, then as an RN for 21 years at Wesley Medical Center. I began in Pediatric ICU and found out quickly that wasn't for me! I worked the rest of my time on a Gyn floor and loved it! When our son Kevin died, I didn't want any more stress - just wanted to hand out hotel keys, but Rod discouraged me from doing that. I worked for a friend at the Rock Road car wash, then went to work for optometrists Dr.'s Fisher, Yarrow, and Fleming for 10 years and I am now retired!!! "

Rod said the Navy shaped his life. "I was a Plane Captain and flew with the Navy Hurricane Hunters. I was assigned to one aircraft out of a squadron and performed the engine hydraulics and flight control maintenance. I went with the aircraft wherever it flew. Stationed at the Naval Air Station in Jacksonville, FL, I made numerous trips to as many as 21 different foreign locations." Even though she has lived in nine various locations, Claudia says, "I wish I could have gone to the places Rod did in the service."



Claudia remembers, "We met on a blind date- my suite mate in nurses training was dating Rod's roommate. Rod had a chopped Triumph motorcycle much to my nurse mother's horror! When Rod came home to meet my folks after he left Dad said. "Ol' Evil left a grease spot in my garage." We still have a good laugh about that one!!!! Rod never did propose - it was, "when we get married." I didn't know for sure until I got the ring!!!! We were married on July 20th 1974 after Rod got out of the service - set a record high

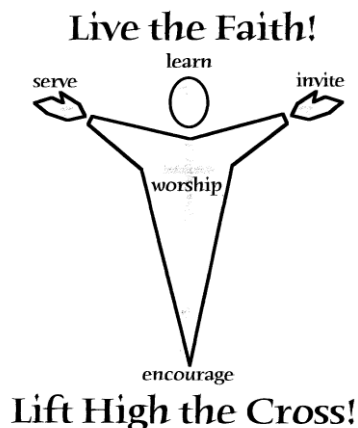
temp that year after I finished my boards! We honeymooned in where else?..... the Black Hills of South Dakota. lol

We have been blessed with the best kids and grandkids ever. We have three sons. Scott, his wife Roxanne and three kids Morgan (16) Madison (13) and Gavin(11) live in Clearwater, our second son, Kevin, died at 17, and our third son Casey, his wife Starla, and son Austin (11) live in Forney, Texas. We love to do things together: canoe in Oklahoma, go to the Salt Mine in Hutchinson, watch Wichita State play basketball and baseball, watch kids play sports, go to South Dakota, holidays, and occasional meals together! There is no better gift than the gift of our children's and grandchildren's time!!!

A fond family memory of Claudia's, "When my grandfather died and Kevin, who was then two, put his chubby little arms around my neck and looked me straight in the eye and said "Mom don't cry. God will take real good care of Grandpa!" Nothing ever made me feel as good at that moment! We have had many pets over the years: dogs, cats, parakeets, a cockatiel, and numerous reptiles, bugs, and you name it that the kids would drag home at any given time. We now have a dog we adopted from the Humane Society named Sweet Basil who only has one ear flap. She is part Border Collie and part Lab and is definitely smarter than Rod and I put together. We have 2 cats Bogey and Buddy, and a 16 yr. old cockatiel named Kramer.

Claudia says, we volunteer at the Humane Society on Tues mornings. I walk dogs and Rod and another friend take pictures of dogs for their website. We like to go to movies!
