Central States Synod Assembly will be June 6-8 at the Marriott in Kansas City/ Overland Park at 10800 Metcalf Avenue,

Overland Park, Kansas 66210. The Synod Assembly is the highest legislative authority of the synod. In addition to conducting the business of the synod, voting members and visitors gather for worship, presentations, and workshops designed to support the ministry we do together as a synod.

This year's agenda includes a full slate of elections including: Bishop, Synod Council Officers, Several Synod Council members, and multiple committee members. Information on the Bishop's election process, council and committee nominations are available on the synod website at: <u>www.css-elca.org</u>.

Our keynote speaker is Dr. Rich Melheim (www.richmelheim.com), Founder/CEO, RICH Learning Global, the RICH Learning International Foundation, the Preschool Incubators Project, Faith Inkubators, the Faith Inkubators Foundation, and curator of Cross+Gen Life.

While all active Rostered Ministers are required to attend, the voting membership is at least 60% lay persons. That 60% is sent from all congregations and worshipping communities across the synod. Happy Birthday! RLC Is (nearly) 60 Years Old!

On Sunday, May 5, 2019, the congregation will celebrate its 60th anniversary with a special worship service and noon luncheon. Central States Synod Bishop, Gustafson will be



present. Mark the date on your calendars and plan to attend this special event.

Resurrection Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haysville, Kansas was formally established on Sunday, May 3, 1959, in an organizational service officiated by the Reverend Doctor Reno R Frobenius, President of the Evangelical Synod of the Central States of the United Lutheran Church in America. The order for the Organization was conducted at 11:00 a.m. in the House Chapel at 134 South German in Haysville.

The first congregational meeting was held that same evening at 7:00 p.m. in the House Chapel with twentyeight members of the congregation present. The congregation adopted Articles of Incorporation, a Constitution and By-laws, elected nine deacons to serve as the church council, and issued a call to Reverend Leo R Nielsen, the Mission Developer of the congregation, to serve as its first pastor. Dr Frobenius represented the Synod at the meeting. Pastor Nielsen accepted the call and presided over the remainder of the meeting. The congregation was officially incorporated by the State of Kansas on May 21, 1959, as a legal not-for-profit corporation under the laws of the State.

Called pastors have included the following: Leo R Nielsen, Paul L Rowaldt, C Arthur Freeberg, Jonathan Jensen, Daniel Swenson, C. Timothy Leaf, and Elizabeth Cutler Cummings. Pastor Alfred Lindberg served as our supply pastor from 1989-1996.

The first church council in 1959-1960 included the following: Arthur Bissell, Thomas Gregory, C Dwain Schmidt, Virgil Schmidt, George Dhority, Ted Moody, George Swanson, Harold Smith, Herbert Bauer, Jimlee Kemper, Wayne E Clark, Donald Beason and James A Brown.

Family Promise

Kristina Crawford, Family Promise coordinator at Haysville Christian Church, spoke at our church to introduce us to this organization and their program.

Family Promise is an organization that helps homeless

families achieve sustainable independence through a community based response. The program works through host churches that open their churches in the evenings for a week at a time and provide an evening meal and fellowship with the guests in the program. Guests spend the night in that church and are then transported back to the day house where they are given numerous supports, services, life skills and guidance to help them regain their independence. Guests in the program have all been background checked and have many standards and expectations that they must adhere to if they wish to be in the program. Another important aspect of the program is that the day house allows children in the program to have a permanent address and have a regular bus stop right at the day house.

During 2018 Resurrection Lutheran Church (RLC) began serving as a support congregation for Haysville Christian Church (HCC) when they have their host weeks. Congregations serve as a host church to guests in the program 4 times per year. We currently have 10 individuals within our congregation trained and serving in this ministry.

Our goal in supporting HCC is to fill all volunteer slots on two days during HCC's host week to help reduce some of the stress on the host congregation. This has been a great opportunity for us to become involved in the program. On host weeks we have been assisting by purchasing food for meals, preparing meals and having fellowship time with guests in the evening. This is a very easy way to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ and we are looking to add more volunteers from our congregation.

Before you will be able to volunteer you must complete a simple one-hour volunteer training. We have a training scheduled for May 4th at 11 a.m. at RLC but there are several other options if you want to get trained before this. There are also some other opportunities to support this ministry such as washing bedding in preparation for host week, setting up guest's rooms and cooking that we need volunteers for and these tasks can be done without going through the training. We are currently preparing for our next host week with HCC which will run the week of February 24th through March 2nd and all volunteer spots are filled. Our following host week with HCC is not until the week of May 19th and we will begin filling volunteer slots 4-5weeks prior.

A team of eight volunteers, including Clark Sholts from our church, agreed to meet for the developmental phase of this program in our Wichita area churches.

Hello Church Stewards! Welcome from the Property Committee. Thanks for your continued support for our Church Property.

There are numerous projects for the future that are currently being funded by your donations. First on the list and coming up this spring will be a New Storage Shed funded through the Property Fundraising Events. - The Goal has been met - Thank You, - "Sow and You Shall Reap". We plan on a "Keep It or Pitch It" Day for all committees that currently have items in the old shed. We plan on a large dumpster for "Pitch It" and this will be a spring cleaning event for other items within the Church. The old shed will be torn down and pitched unless someone in the Congregation has a need for it. If you do - it will have to be a prompt removal after cleanout. (see property committee member).


Two other projects that continue to be funded are the Flooring Fund (Fellowship Hall & Bathroom Hall/ Kitchen Area) and the LED Sign Fund. Future Flooring Fund projects after this one is complete will be The Narthax and Sanctuary areas.

Another item that will sneak up on us will be the Parking Lot Bulb replacements. Our current bulbs have a life span of 4 to 5 years. We have been Blessed with no issues but are running on borrowed time. Property Committee is looking into LED replacement bulbs. Up front expenses are high but we should see a 70 to 80% reduction in our current \$100 a month electric parking lot bill. The LED bulbs have a 5 year replacement guarantee and a 10 year life span.

As the Church grows and our building gets older, we are seeing more and more maintenance items that unexpectedly need our attention. We are very Blessed here at Resurrection for our faithful contributors which allow us to take care of scheduled and unscheduled "Thank You One and All". maintenance issues. Fundraisers this year for the Property Committee are February 10th - "Valentines Brunch" and October 13th - "Oktoberfest".

Remembering Pastor Sally Fahrenthold




Area Ministry 5 joins with those all around our community and Synod and beyond who remember and give thanks for the Rev. Sally Curtiss Fahrenthold who died at home, November 21st. Born June

23, 1937, she was a graduate of Smith College, received her M.Div. at Saint Paul School of Theology, Kansas City, and studied at Luther Theological Seminary, St. Paul, MN. While she worked at Metro Lutheran Ministry in Kansas City she initiated community services such as emergency assistance and advocacy, Harvesters-The Community Food Network, Warmth and Light Coalition, and Kansas City Community Gardens. Sally advocated and helped launch services for people with disabilities such as Johnson County Developmental Supports, and Community Living Opportunities. In Wichita she was active in Wichita's Inter-Faith Ministries, C.R.O.P. Hunger Walk and The Greater Wichita Ministerial League. She helped form Partners for Wichita, including the "Filling the Gap Lunches for Kids" meals program. Sally received the Kansas City Spirit Award in 1984 and her honors also include recognition by Wichita Church Women United and League of Women Voters Wichita-Metro. She had a passion for those who are poor, disabled, or suffering injustice, as well as appreciation for working together with people of many faiths, races, and backgrounds. Sally served as Associate Pastor of Atonement Lutheran Church, Overland Park, KS and as Pastor of Christ Lutheran Church, Wichita, KS. She served as interim or temporary pastor at Reformation Lutheran Church and St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Wichita, and she was editor of the Area Ministry 5 Messenger for a number of years and circulation manager for the last 5 years. She liked to bring together many gifts and experiences of people in worship and service. The Wichita Eagle published an article on her work for social justice on November 24th.

** SPOTLIGHT **



Betty Batten

I was born June 4, 1944 in Wayne, Nebraska (God's country) to German, Lutheran parents. I had an awesome childhood--raised on a farm among four sisters and one brother. Both of my parents spoke German as children and as adults when they didn't want us to know something they were discussing.

We spent a lot of time outdoors inventing our own pastimes. We made mud pies with eggs from the hen house and "sold" mud pies and "coffee" at a restaurant we set up in the grove. We borrowed dad's tools when we needed them for making hangers for our doll clothes which we dressed our cats in when walking them (or running them--before they jumped out) down the lane in our doll buggy.

We designed our amusement park by sweeping an area for play equipment which we devised ourselves--a grease barrel ("rolla-rolla") that we walked on by balancing, for example. We also "walked the fence", by balancing on the top 2 X 4 board of the cattle pens. We swept the pig pen to roller skate. We made it through childhood by God's grace and good balance--all 6 of us.

My chores were washing the eggs that we sold in Wayne (egg money paid for piano lessons that we took in the 7th and 8th grades after our catechism classes on Saturdays at 1:00 p.m.). I also had to wash the separator and set the table for meals as well as making supper while Mother milked cows. Dad didn't really let us help with farm work, so after 5 girls, they were ready for a boy.

I attended a one-room school in the same section our farm was in. We walked 1/2 mile, uphill, both ways! Other activities were 4-H (sewing and baking), Sunday school, junior choir and later, Luther League and senior choir. After high school, we all attended Wayne State because it was close and we could live at home. All the girls became teachers and my brother, a veterinarian.

Brent and I met while attending Emporia State where I was employed at the lab school. After living a couple of years in Wichita, we moved to Clearwater and still live in our first home.
