RUSSIA VISITS RESURRECTION

On Sunday, June 15 we were blessed with a visit from Bishop August Kruse and Pastor Manfred Brockman of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Russia and Other States (ELCROS). Bishop Kruse is the first Russian Bishop of ELCROS, and Pastor Brockman serves as Dean of the eight ELCROS churches in the Russian Far East, Resurrection's CSS Companion Synod.

Bishop Kruse and Pastor Brockman were in Wichita for the Global Mission Festival on June 14th at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church. They spent Sunday morning preaching and visiting with the congregation. Bishop Kruse and Pastor Brockman spoke with the children during the children's sermon, showing them where Russia is on a map of the world and speaking about the global mission and our congregation's connections around the world. Maggie and Paxton Leaf also presented our guests with gifts of candy and boxes to store goodies in that were disguised as Bibles.

Bishop Kruse and Pastor Brockman also preached during the sermon, including a special greeting from Bishop Kruse that was translated for us by Pastor Brockman.

How many Lutheran pastors does it take to baptize 525 people?

This is not the beginning of a joke but an invitation coming from the congregations in Lutherstadt Eisleben to you and your congregation. Let us explain: Our congregation worships in the church where the great reformer, Luther, was baptized. We still use the remnants of the baptismal font over which the baby Martin was held to receive God's promise. Every year, we mark the anniversary of Luther's baptism with a service of baptismal remembrance. But this year, because we mark the 525th anniversary of Luther's baptism, we would like to find 525 congregations around the globe to come together in baptismal remembrance with us. Maybe, we will even find 525 people who will decide to receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism either in Eisleben or in their congregations on that occasion. If you want to join us in marking this special occasion by lifting up the importance and relevance of baptism in your life or in the life of your congregation, this is what we are offering to you:

- If you are a pastor, bring a church group to Eisleben and celebrate baptismal remembrance with us. If your congregation has baptismal candidates, bring them with you so that you can baptize them at our historic location.
- If you would like to get baptized and have received the proper instruction and permission by your congregation's pastor, you can come here and be baptized.
- If you can't travel here, you can still join us in celebrating baptismal remembrance on this special occasion by using one of the resources we will provide on our website www.Luther525.de.

No matter what you decide to do, we would love to hear how you and your congregation will celebrate the 525th anniversary of Luther's baptism so that we can publish it on our website.

Resurrection has been accepted as one of the participating congregations. To date, we are the only church in Kansas and one of only 10 in the USA registered for this baptismal remembrance.

This fall brings kids and grown-ups together for faith-building experiences. A new curriculum, Living the Good News, will be used by young people age 3 through grade 7. This curriculum will provide students with indepth studies of the lectionary readings that are read during worship every Sunday. Small groups of similarly-aged kids will come together every Sunday to explore the stories and lessons of the Bible. Activities and projects will focus on developing relationships and teaching Bible stories. We hope to build connections for families through our time together.

Rally Day will kick off the learning year on Sunday, September 7. Plan to invite your family, friends, and neighbors to Sunday School every Sunday at 10:00 a.m.

The Jr/Sr Sunday School Class will continue their studies of Here We Stand Confirmation from Augsburg Fortress Publishers. They will be reviewing/studying Bible Stories from both the Old and New Testaments. Along with their studies they will be incorporating various art projects for the benefit of the youth and our congregation; introducing Christian artists; and working on fundraisers. The class will also be designing Christmas ornaments to be donated to WELCA for their annual Bazaar.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Our young people had a tree-top Bible blast in June during Vacation Bible School. The sanctuary and auxiliary spaces were recreated to be a Rain Forest Adventure for three hours every night. Many, many adults worked together to bring the Bible to life through crafts, science, storytelling, singing, and games. Even our youngest found a safe place in the forest to learn about God. One student reports, "I liked the crafts...that art stuff... because you got to make creative things and you got to make cool stuff on your own and you got to paint." Another child said, "I liked the rain forest because it looked realistic!" What a way to teach appreciation for God's great earth. Students brought offerings each night which were contributed to the tornado recovery effort at Scherer Memorial Lutheran Church in Chapman, Kansas. A church family trip to the Sedgwick County Zoo was a highlight celebration at the end of June.

Church Environmentally Friendly THE ASSOCIATED PRESS

WOOSTER - Members of the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship like green so much they're even considering growing grass on their roof.

The church is the only one in the country that boasts a gold rating from the U.S. Green Building Council, and one of only three buildings in Ohio to earn the designation.

"It is a source of special pride to our congregation," said Anne Wilson, church administrator and a member of the building committee.

As part of its environmentally responsible design, the building features airtight walls and a modern heating and cooling system that uses 40 percent less energy than regular systems while operating without ozone-depleting chemicals. The building's windows were designed to allow cross ventilation and reduce summertime dependence on air conditioning, and translucent panels installed in the walls allow natural light to filter from one room to the next. The church also worked in amenities that encourage its members to adopt green lifestyles, including a bike rack and shower stall for those who prefer to pedal, rather than drive, to services. Patrons who drive park on a grass parking lot with an underlying layer of gravel designed to let rainwater seep into the ground.

Although congregants were squarely behind the idea of becoming a green building, they did veto a proposal to add solar panels to the church's roof, because the cost was too high. That doesn't mean the church doesn't put its roof to good use, though. A rooftop cistern catches rainwater that is used to flush the building's toilets and irrigate plants on the property.

Planning Ahead: Thrivent Builds – Habitat for Humanity

First: A heartfelt <u>THANK YOU</u> to all who helped with the 2008 Thrivent Build. There are now two grateful families living in and caring for their own homes.

On July 22nd, enthusiastic Congregation Champions and Thrivent Chapter Presidents, representing six congregations, met for a critique and planning meeting.

Our discussion resulted in a tentative plan to again build two houses, side by side, in Habitat Village, with a start date of March 24 and completion by May 2, 2009. We would work Tuesday through Saturday the first week, and then for the next five weeks work Thursday through Saturday finishing the houses after 20 work days.

With the support of Linda Stewart, Executive Director of Wichita Habitat for Humanity, whose presence and input was greatly appreciated, these leaders agreed to the plan described above. This plan will be subject to a Thrivent funding grant for two houses. Our Thrivent Builds Representative for Kansas and part of Missouri, Stan Stanfield, has indicated that Thrivent would like us to build two houses. Official approval won't happen until early December.


